Interim Policy

To farm vendors

Sale of Produce grown off the Peninsula but within the borders of BC.

“this applies to vegetables and fruit only”

- that farm vendors may sell produce grown elsewhere,
 - if it does not unduly impact other farm vendor sales
 - if all other farm vendors agree to the ‘off island’ produce sales
 - if there is no ‘unfair’ or ‘undue’ price cutting or dumping of produce
- that all of the farm market vendors are aware of the policy
- that this permission applies only to our ‘farm’ market vendors
- that it is clear or visible these sales are an extension of a farm to help with its economic viability, and that it is not seen as just a form of produce retailing without a direct association with a productive farm.
- that if the Market Manager and/or Board rules there is an infraction on this policy and requests the vendor to remove the produce, the vendor will remove the produce immediately. The Board, The Manager and The Vendor will within the next week (the following 7 days) review the case.
